Content Area	The District's 2019-2020 Academic Standards
English (includes reading and writing)	Waterford Union High School English courses provide curriculum aligned to the Wisconsin Academic Standards (WAS) .
Mathematics	Waterford Union High School mathematics courses provide curriculum aligned to the Wisconsin Academic Standards (WAS) .
Science	Waterford Union High School science courses provide curriculum aligned to the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) .
Social Studies (includes geography and history)	Waterford Union High School social studies courses provide curriculum aligned to the Wisconsin Academic Standards (WAS) .
Advanced Placement	Specialty courses, such as those in the Advanced Placement program, follow rigorous curriculum based the on academic standards established by the College Board.
Transcripted Credit Courses	Transcripted Credit courses are postsecondary courses, which are taught at a high school by teachers certified to teach those courses. Curriculum for these courses is based on academic standards established at the postsecondary level.
